

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is sponsoring the event?

In the United States The Million Woman March for Endometriosis is sponsored by Dr. Camran Nezhat, Dr. Farr Nezhat, Dr Ceaná Nezhat and Dr. Azzie Nezhat of the Nezhat Family Foundation and co-sponsored by the American Society for Reproductive Medicine.

In the UK there isn't a sponsor, therefore we have **no funding** to make this event happen. Endometriosis UK are overseeing the event with help from a voluntary committee. There will be a registration fee to participate in this event. See further details below.

What are the goals of the march?

The overarching goal is to raise awareness of endometriosis, but the Million Woman March for Endometriosis also seeks to promote the following:

Empowerment

To unite women and their supporters to take a stand against endometriosis

Education

To raise awareness of the condition and its effect on women and girls

To educate and train members of the healthcare professions in order to promote early diagnosis and improved treatment

Effecting Change

To seek a cure for endometriosis and develop non-invasive diagnostic tests

To implement assessment programmes for young women and girls in education

To work with government to allocate funding for endometriosis



How do I register for the event?

Only individuals who have signed up [here](#) to the event and have paid a registration fee will be able to attend. This event is not open to non-registered participants. The standard registration fee is **£15**, or **£25** if you would like an Endometriosis UK t-shirt included.

Why is the event not free?

We have no sponsor for the event, therefore we have **no funding** to make this event happen. Endometriosis is a very small charity that receives minimal funding. The cost of the Million Woman March for Endometriosis – UK Event only covers basic costs for the event. The organisation **is not** making any profit from this event.

We are a very tiny small organisation and we are really trying our best. We do not have the resources to fully organise this event. Therefore, Endometriosis UK are overseeing the event with help from a voluntary committee.

Our voluntary committee have thought long and hard about the charges - we would love to be able to have everyone attend free of charge but as we do not have any private funding for this event the costs of making it happen need to be borne by those taking part. Here is the breakdown of costs based on 200 participants:

First aid cover	£2
Marshal cover	£2.50
Administrative costs	£1.50
Banners/publicity	£1
Postage & packing	£1.50
Incidental cover	£1.50
Total	£15
T shirt cost plus postage & packaging	£10



What if I don't think I can afford the registration fee?

We are aware some people may not be able to attend the event due to costs. If you do not feel that you can afford the registration fee, you could consider fundraising

Where in the UK will the event be taking place?

What is the schedule for the day of the event?

The event will take place from 12noon until 3pm approximately. Check in will be open from 11.30am and there will be a group photo at 2pm. Further details will be provided once you have registered.

What are we doing at the event in London?

A 2.5 mile awareness walk for women with endometriosis and their friends and family to raise the profile of endometriosis and to show their support for the other sufferers around world.

How do I become a local representative, city/town captain?

Become a local representative by registering as a city/town captain. It will be your job as a regional representative to gather all participants' interest and organise the travel and
